REMEMBRANCE.

November is the season of Remembrance; which the dictionary defines as the 'action of remembering something' and specifically 'the action of remembering the dead.'

So remembrance is not a passive thing which just happens, but a deliberate and intentional act which carries with it ideas of someone or something special and worthy of thanksgiving and gratitude, with deep meaning for our lives.

First comes All Saints on 1st November when we remember with thanksgiving the whole company of Saints and Martyrs during Christian history, followed by All Souls on November 2nd when we remember all the faithful departed; the saints with a small 's', including our own loved ones.

It can be a comfort to go to a reflective church service and light a candle for them, which is why there will be All Souls' services in our churches at Wereham on Tuesday 1st November and at Whittington on the 2nd.

Then on Remembrance Sunday, this year on November 13th, we come together to honour with gratitude those who gave everything in the defence of our country and the freedoms and values which we hold dear. Principally we think of the two world wars of the 20th century, but Remembrance Sunday has come to embrace those others who have died in many conflicts since.

This time last year we did not dream that on Remembrance Sunday 2022 there would be a war raging in Europe again and refugees from that conflict living among us while their loved ones are fighting for their lives back home in the Ukraine.

So while we pray constantly for Ukraine and all peoples suffering from war, and that there may be an end to all hostilities, in this season we also pray for our loved ones who have gone before us to where 'He will wipe every tear from their eyes and there will be no more death or mourning or crying or pain..'

I particularly like this Prayer which is often used at Remembrance Sunday services because of the belief that however and at whatever stage of life a person died, God's loving purpose for them cannot be thwarted but will still be fulfilled as it will be for us all.

Almighty and eternal God,
From whose love we cannot be parted,
either by death or life:
hear our prayers and thanksgivings
for all whom we remember this day;
Fulfil in them the purpose of your love;
and bring us all, with them, to your eternal joy;
through Jesus Christ our Lord.

COUNTRYSIDE NOTES SPIDERS

Spiders are members of the Arachnid family of which there are around 650 species in the UK. All Arachnids have eight legs and look like insects, the only difference being that insects have six. UK spiders range in size from tiny with a leg span of just a couple of millimetres up to large at 70mm across. They are predators equipped with a pair of fangs with which they catch their prey. Some will eat other spiders.

The larger outdoor spiders construct elaborate webs which are displayed to perfection in autumn when dew glistens on them. A species of Money Spider, Lepthyphantes tenuis, is believed to be the most common and one of the smallest and is normally found in low growing vegetation and leaf litter. Members of this family are responsible for the carpets of gossamer draped over fields of short grass which shimmer in the early morning light.

There are many kinds of spiders categorised as 'house spiders' which vary greatly in shape and size and appear to be mostly nocturnal. Daddy long-legs spiders have very small bodies and can be found anywhere in the house. They weave untidy webs even crossing a room with their invisible threads. Harvestmen or Harvest spiders look very similar but have no silk glands and therefore cannot spin webs. There are other little black spiders which seem to prefer living close to the ceiling and big black ones which show an unwelcome desire to take up residence in the bath. I usually catch these and drop them out of the window but quite often they soon reappear even though our bathroom is upstairs. September is definitely the month of the house spider. It is the time when they seem particularly active not only looking for a mate but invading our homes in search of a place to spend the winter which is warm and dry with plenty of nooks and crannies to hide in.

One of the largest species of spider found in the UK with a span of 7cms, including its legs, is the very rare Raft Fen spider. It only lives in fens and wetlands and is able to walk on the water surface. Only three populations are known in the UK one of which is Redgrave and Lopham Fen on the Norfolk/ Suffolk border. The Water spider is the only species that lives underwater.

There are 12 venomous species of spiders in the UK of which the most feared is the False Widow spider which arrived from warmer countries as a stowaway on ships a century ago. Described as the UK's most venomous spider its bite is said to be on a par with a wasp sting. The very hot summer has meant they have bred in high numbers. People who suffer from Arachnophobia have an extreme or irrational fear of spiders. Various deterrents are tried including dried citrus peel and putting down strong smelling liquids such as peppermint or lavender oil. The age old practice of placing conkers around the house is unproven. *Jill Mason*

WNAS October 2022

Following an assignment he made some years ago to talk to us about his exploits in Antarctica, Steven Parker from Feltwell, paid us another visit to account for the role he played in the handling of the Falklands war, code named operation Black Buck.

Stephen, who spent 23 years in the RAF, was stationed at Marham for 5 years serving as Chief Technician whilst working on Victor Bombers. During his time there, the war broke out and 24 of these bombers were converted into tankers in

order to refuel the Waddington based Vulcan (nicknamed the flat iron) which had been chosen to target the Argentine held Port Stanley airport. Steven seemed to have his own rather cynical view about whether this was a wise decision especially when it was revealed that a slide rule bought on Swaffham Market was used to assist with the calculations involved in the planning of the refuelling operations. Eighteen of the converted Victors waiting at Wideawake airport on the RAF Ascension Island were to be juggled in training exercises before the actual assault. Steven, now based there too, gave an account of his own personal problems: breathing (dust); accommodation (tents); manoeuvring aeroplanes (Vulcan's weight so great with cargo, bombs and fuel the wheels sunk into the soft runway). Steven also gave an account of the part played by other support aircraft. Among them were: Sea Harrier jump jet, Nimrod and Hercules. The latter was another aircraft adapted for tanker duties, but, Steven remarked, 'owing to its speed limitation it needed to adopt an unconventional flying attitude': once connected to its recipient the pair would descend in a shallow dive in order to transfer fuel more efficiently.

At the end of his talk Steven, very modestly, revealed that he and an associate of his, Brian Martin, had written a book entitled 'Marham Tankers'. So impressed was our base Commander, David A, that he suggested our society buy three of these to present to worthy stalwarts of our crew: twenty one strong on the night.

As well, our Commander has organised a morning splinter group meeting at 1100 hrs on the following Friday to chat about fascinating trivia and provide succour to some of our veteran members who find it difficult to attend the speaker meetings in the evening.





We were also able to claim the VAT on part of the repair and restoration amounting to £704.

Special thanks to Tom Golden who played the restored organ at our Afternoon Tea so beautifully I saw a tear or two in many an eye – including mine! Special thanks also to Holmes and Swift aka Edmund and Margaret for carrying out such a magnificent repair and tender restoration.






