REMEMBER - REMEMBER

Many of us will remember the rest of the rhyme - the fifth of November, gunpower, treason and plot! Yes, a rhyme, but originally a chant. One that was chanted round a bonfire with an effigy of a conspirator in a plot to assassinate the king and blow up parliament. That conspirator's name was Guy Fawkes. He was what the American's call 'a fall guy' (unintended pun) because the chief conspirator was named as Robert Catesby. This foiled attempt at a *coup d' etat* we continue to celebrate on Guy Fawkes night with bonfires and fireworks.

The cause behind the plot was essentially religious. Catesby was a devout Roman Catholic who wanted to kill the Protestant King James 1st eliminate the Protestant parliamentarians and establish England as a Catholic country. I just hear the cries of 'religions cause wars'. And, one has to admit, there is a degree of justification for those assertions. For the Gunpowder Plot can be seen as a precursor to the English Civil War that began less than 40 years later in 1642. Incidentally, for our younger readers, *the* civil war was not just that between the Confederacy and the Union in the nineteenth century.

Why do we continue to remember the events of the past? One poinient quote from Winston Churchill is: those who do not learn from history are doomed to repeat it. The question is - does mankind learn from history? At face value, that would appear not to be so! We crave peace and rightly pray for peace. And yet there are, to quote Jesus the Prince of Peace, wars and insurrections (Luke 21: 9). He also said Blessed are the peacemakers for they shall be called children of God (Matthew 5: 9). The implication being that there would always be a need for peacemakers.

As I write this, war has again broken out in The Holy Land. I feel that epithet to be a misnomer! The Archbishops of Canterbury and York have written to all the Church of England Dioceses stating that they are *deeply grieved and concerned at the violence in Israel and Gaza*. Just as we all are at this outrageous tide of hideous terrorism. My personal belief being that, perhaps in different ways, both sides need to be called to account for their deeds. We continue to pray for all the other areas of the world where there is open warfare and where peace is fragile.

This year Remembrance Sunday is on the 12th of November. Being the closest Sunday to the date of the cessation of hostilities that marked the end of the First World War in 1918. We rightly pay tribute to the heroism and self-sacrifice of all the service personnel who suffered both mentally and physically as well as those who gave up their lives in the cause of freedom. In that conflict more than one hundred years ago and many hundreds of wars and insurrections since. Let us remember in our prayers all who live with the scars of battle and those who care for them. Proceeding those events during November, there is All Souls Day. When we particularly remember and give thanks for our loved ones who have passed from our sight to be eternally with our Heavenly Father. *Tony Mills*

COUNTRYSIDE NOTES

Invasive and Alien species

Grey squirrels, Muntjac and American mink, which cause significant damage to our native flora and fauna, are alien species of mammals now commonplace in the wild. In the UK the number of established invasive species, in one form or another, is estimated to be between 2,000 and 3,000 and increasing annually. The estimated cost to the economy is £4 billion a year compared to £1.7 billion in 2010! To forestry it is calculated to be £123 million, while agriculture, the most affected, is around £1.1 billion. Global warming is hastening the invaders success enabling some of them to survive and encouraging others to move northwards and spread widely across the country with devastating consequences. Despite strict import checks it's impossible to fully protect our native species and this is aggravated by people either bringing seeds or plants back with them from countries they've visited or dumping them instead of disposing of them responsibly. Imported diseases come in bacterial, fungal, virus and insect forms. More and more are being identified in the wild, principally having arrived here through importations of timber, young trees and plants from abroad. Some spread quickly and at least twenty are attacking our native trees.

Ramorum disease, a contagious fungus, is widespread and affects many species including Sweet Chestnut and Oak trees. First discovered on Larch trees in 2009 it has led to thousands of hectares being felled. Ash Dieback is relentlessly taking its toll as did Dutch Elm Disease in the 1970s. Great Spruce Bark Beetles are now present in Western England, Wales and Southern Scotland. They damage spruce trees, widely grown for commercial timber, by tunnelling into the bark. Horse Chestnut Leaf Miners turn the leaves brown and caterpillars of Oak Processionary Moths defoliate oak trees and are a health hazard to humans.

Rhododendron is hugely invasive and forms into large, impenetrable patches several metres high. It also carries diseases fatal to some of our native trees. Seriously invasive plants are now widely distributed across the UK. Japanese knotweed is notorious for causing structural damage to properties. The sap of Giant Hogweed is toxic, touching it releases a chemical which reacts with sunlight causing burns and blisters. Spanish Bluebells, introduced by the Victorians, are similar in appearance and readily hybridise with our native bluebells. Pirri Pirri is a dwarf shrubby plant widespread in some dry coastal areas that forms dense mats which overwhelm native plants. Our ponds and waterways are being choked by alien aquatic plants sold as ornamentals. Because they grow so prolifically Floating Pennywort, Parrot's Feather, and Curly and Nuttall's Waterweed are being dumped by irresponsible pond owners. In rivers and streams American Signal Crayfish are decimating our native crayfish as are Asian Clams our freshwater molluscs. They are already established in the Norfolk Broads. On the banks Himalayan Balsam is displacing the natural plants. Harlequin Ladybirds prey on our native ladybird larva as do Asian Hornets on bees and pollinating insects.



The British Legion Poppy Appeal

Ever wondered where the idea of Remembrance Poppies came from? Why we use a red poppy to remember those who have given service in one of our armed forces during conflicts? Well here are a few things I found out.


We all know that wearing a poppy demonstrates support for Armed Service Personnel, Veterans and their families and has been a symbol of remembrance for over 100 years. During the First World War the only thing that would grow in the battle fields after the destruction and bombing was the red poppy.

Did you know that after losing a friend at Ypres in 1915 a doctor from Canada, Lieutenant Colonel John McCrae, was inspired to write a poem about the poppies growing in the battle scared fields entitled "In Flanders Fields". The poem inspired the then US War Secretary, Moina Michael, to buy poppies to sell to her friends to raise funds for service men in need after the First World War. This idea was adopted by the British Legion in 1921 when millions of poppies were sold on the 11th of November at the first Poppy Appeal.

Today, the funds raised help the British Legion support active service personnel, veterans and their families in many ways including financial assistance, rehabilitation, help with employment and housing along with many other vital services including The Battle Back Centre in the West Midlands which is the first port of call for wounded, injured and sick service men and women.

Poppies will be available to purchase in St Andrews church along with wooden crosses which have a poppy on them. A donation of £3 is suggested for the crosses then you can remember a loved one by inscribing their name on the cross and placing it around the War Memorial in the church grounds.

St Andrews PCC

Barton Bendish Parish Council Meeting held 27th September 2023

Boughton Long Road The Council recently asked the Parish Clerk to discuss with the Norfolk County Council Highways Engineer the potential for reducing the speed limit to 40mph on Boughton Long Road. The NCC Highways Engineer provided the following guidance: Firstly, Boughton Long Road does not meet the criteria set by NCC for a reduction in speed limit from its current 60mph. Secondly, it was advised that the Parish Council should monitor the effectiveness of the upcoming village gateways installation (due by Dec 2023). Lastly, an alternative solution was proposed, wherein the Parish Council could explore the possibility of a SAM2 (flashing speed awareness) device within the boundary of the existing 30mph speed limit, as these monitors are not permitted on a 60mph road. The Council will continue to monitor road safety concerns on Boughton Long Road once the village gateways have been installed. Small Grants Scheme can help projects that aim to make life better in West Norfolk (Borough Council of West Norfolk & King's Lynn)

A Small Grants Scheme has been launched in West Norfolk to support community projects and initiatives aimed at improving the lives of local residents. The scheme, backed by the Norfolk Community Foundation, offers funding for both capital and revenue costs, with grants of up to £10,000 available. Projects should align with specific outcomes, such as promoting cultural understanding, increasing community involvement, and enhancing community spaces. Applications are open until November 30, 2023, and a panel will convene in early 2024 to select grant recipients.


The next meeting will take place on Wednesday 8th November 2023. This will be an Ordinary Parish Council Meeting starting at 7.30 pm in the Village Hall.

St Mary's Church Update

Update on the Restoration of St Mary's Church. If all goes according to plan, by the time you read this article you will have seen the roofs of St Mary's rise from the wall tops. At the time of writing, the east gable end is being completed with

the refurbished coping stones finishing it off. Between the 16th and 18th of October the roof trusses arrived and were installed. There then followed a period of joinery to secure complete the basic roof over the nave and chancel. And by now, early November, I would hope that you can see the thatcher working on the north church side of the roof. simultaneously, the south aisle metal roof will be restored. Once the latter is



complete, and any hot works done, the thatcher will complete the south side of the main roof.

At this stage we will have back a building that externally resembles our much loved church. Of course this is not the end of the work, we still have to complete the electrics and heating, plaster the interior and the new ceiling, glaze the whole building and restore all the wall monuments and war memorial."

MOBILE LIBRARY

We are writing to let you know about the changes that are being made to the mobile library service, following the public consultation last year and the final decisions made by Norfolk County Council Cabinet in January 2023. We are preparing to decommission one mobile library and continue to operate five vehicles and an electric mini mobile, due for commission later this year. In accordance with the key principles agreed by Members, Norfolk Library and Information Service will cease the majority of stops that happen within 1.5 miles of a branch library.

We will be working with customers to ensure they know what is happening. Anyone that is unable to visit a branch library will be able to contact their local library and request a visit from the Home Library Service (HLS) that we operate in partnership with the Royal Voluntary Services (RVS).

Every route and stop has now been reviewed and whilst we have tried as hard as we can to minimise disruption, it does mean that in a number of cases the day and time which the mobile library visits has had to change. This is to ensure that we make best use of the mobile library resource for as many people and communities

Customers at all affected stops are being given a copy of the new timetable and the planned introduction date for the revised services is Monday 3rd July. All the new stop and route information will be on our website www.norfolk.gov.uk/libraries (available from 30th June).


